

**Sec. 90-201. - Additional parking prohibitions; snow removal; residential limits.**

- (a) No person shall stand or park a vehicle upon any roadway for the principal purpose of:
- (1) Displaying for sale;
  - (2) Washing, greasing, or repairing such vehicle, except repairs necessitated by an emergency; or
  - (3) Peddling merchandise or selling therefrom.
- (b) Parking during conditions requiring snow removal is prohibited as follows.
- (1) It shall be unlawful to allow any vehicle to remain parked upon any public way under the jurisdiction of the city between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on any day when snow has accumulated to a depth of two inches or more on such public way.
  - (2) This prohibition shall be in effect until the city maintenance crews have cleared the public way and the snowfall has ceased for that day.
  - (3) The presence of operating city snow removal equipment on the public ways of the city shall be conclusive evidence of two inches of snowfall.
  - (4) It is declared the policy of the city that snow removal from the public ways of the city shall not be required where there is less than two inches of snowfall.
  - (5) It shall be unlawful to clean private drives or sidewalks in such a manner as shall result in the deposit of snow into the public ways due to the snow removal from such private drives or sidewalks.
  - (6) Any parking of a vehicle in violation of subsection (b)(1) of this section shall be deemed to constitute an obstruction of traffic, and the city shall remove such vehicle and the owner or operator of such vehicle shall pay the reasonable charges for such removal and storage.
  - (7) Any person violating this subsection shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$25.00 and not more than \$50.00 for each offense.
- (c) Any vehicle required because of greater size or weight to have a license other than a C license under the laws of the state is prohibited from parking on the public right-of-way in all areas zoned residential. For this subsection, all streets leading from First Avenue are considered zoned residential. However, such vehicles may park for the purpose of loading or unloading, only, and such loading or unloading shall be restricted to the hours of 5:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.
