Always make the motion to go into closed session to discuss (one of the 17 exceptions listed on the last page of your agenda) as allowed in 2c 5ILCS 120/2c. Remember Council can go into closed session anytime as long as the exception and statute is stated and each Council member votes to go into closed session. We will continue to work on this as a Council so we will have no more claims with the PAC. Mayor Carter let everyone know that we started to shoot the commercial with the SBA.



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

This determination is issued pursuant to section 3.5(e) of the Open Meetings Act (OMA) (5 ILCS 120/3.5(e) (West 2016)). For the reasons explained below, the Public Access Bureau is unable to conclude that the Silvis City Council (Council) violated OMA at its May 2, 2017, Committee of the Whole meeting.

On July 1, 2017, [redacted] submitted a Request for Review alleging that the Council moved to enter closed session to discuss litigation but did not publicly state the statutory exception authorizing it to enter closed session or accurately record that exception in the minutes of the Committee of the Whole meeting. On July 13, 2017, this office sent a copy of the Request for Review to the Council and requested copies of the May 2, 2017, meeting agenda, minutes, and closed session verbatim recording for this office's confidential review, together with a written response to [redacted] OMA allegations. The Public Access Bureau did not receive a response. On August 4, 2017, this office sent the Council a second letter requesting that it respond to [redacted] Request for Review. On August 11, 2017, the Council provided a written response and a copy of the verbatim recording of the May 2, 2017, meeting. On August 16, 2017, this office sent [redacted] a copy of the Council's written response; she replied on August 25, 2017.

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## DETERMINATION

OMA is intended "to ensure that the actions of public bodies be taken openly and that their *deliberations be conducted openly*." (Emphasis added.) 5 ILCS 120/1 (West 2016). Section 2(a) of OMA (5 ILCS 120/2(a) (West 2016)) provides that all meetings of a public body shall be open to the public unless the subject of the meeting falls within one of the exceptions set out in section 2(c) of OMA (5 ILCS 120/2(c) (West 2016)). The section 2(c) exceptions are to be "strictly construed, extending only to subjects clearly within their scope." 5 ILCS 120/2(b) (West 2016)).

In order for a public body to properly close a portion of a meeting, there must be:

a majority vote of a quorum present, taken at a meeting open to the public for which notice has been given as required by this Act.

\* \* \* The vote of each member on the question of holding a meeting closed to the public and *a citation to the specific exception contained in section 2 of this Act which authorizes the closing of the meeting to the public shall be publicly disclosed* at the time of the vote and shall be recorded and entered into the minutes of the meeting. (Emphasis added.) 5 ILCS 120/2a (West 2016).

Thus, although a public body does not have to give notice of a closed session it intends to hold on a meeting agenda,<sup>1</sup> a public body must publicly disclose the specific exception authorizing the holding of a closed session when it votes to close a portion of a meeting, and that exception needs to be documented in the meeting minutes.

In its response to this office, the Council provided copies of the open session and closed session verbatim recordings and a copy of the closed session minutes. The minutes of the May 2, 2017, Committee of the Whole meeting provided by \_\_\_\_\_ state that "Alderman Bob Rockwell made a motion to go to closed session to discuss a pending litigation as allowed in 2(a) 5 ILCS 120/2(c)."<sup>2</sup> This office's review of the audio recording of the May 2, 2017, open session confirmed that the Council announced "litigation" as its basis for closing a portion of the meeting. A member of the Council can also be heard on the recording stating "pending litigation." Section 2(c)(11) of OMA (5 ILCS 120/2(c)(11) (West 2016)) permits a public body

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to conduct a closed session meeting to discuss litigation "[w]hen an action against, affecting or on behalf of the particular public body has been filed and is pending before a court or administrative tribunal" or when such litigation is "probable or imminent[.]" Our review of the closed session verbatim recording confirms that the Council's closed session discussion stayed within the scope of the section 2(c)(11) exception for pending litigation. Although a citation to the specific statutory exception and would have been helpful, the reference to "litigation" during the meeting and in the minutes was sufficient to satisfy the requirements of section 2a of OMA. *See Wyman v. Schweighart*, 385 Ill. App. 3d 1099, 1105 (4th Dist. 2008). Accordingly, there is insufficient evidence for this office to conclude that the Council's manner of closing the meeting violated section 2a of OMA.

The Public Access Counselor has determined that resolution of this matter does not require the issuance of a binding opinion.
