Item 2) Step 3 Grievance

Alderman Bob Rockwell summarized the Step 3 grievance for the City Council. Alderman Rockwell told Council it has a grievance before them filed by AFSCME on behalf of Shannon Pirmann. The grievance relates to an oral reprimand issued to Mrs. Pirmann on 6 June 2018 as a result of her conduct on May 24th. In accordance with Article 11 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement, the grievance went before the Grievant's direct supervisor City Clerk Jim Nelson at Step 1 and then went before the Personnel Committee at Step 2. The grievance was denied at both steps. The Union argues that the City did not have just cause to issue the oral reprimand. Alderman Rockwell continued with the facts that have been raised throughout the grievance process and which resulted in grieving the oral reprimand. On May 24th 2018 Ms. Pirmann was present in Council Chambers to attend a Union meeting. Ms. Pirmann is the Accountants Assistant/Secretary. During the meeting, she was not acting in her capacity as a City employee nor was she performing any duties within the scope of her position that time. Ms. Pirmann did not ask or request authorization to access or disseminate these employee records. At Step 1, the grievant argued that Jim Grafton, by virtue of simply being present in his office, authorized the disclosure of these records. However, during a meeting with Jim Nelson, Trish Ruhl and the Grievant – the Grievant admitted she never asked Mr. Grafton for permission to access or obtain any employee records from the Clerk's Office that night. The grievance was denied at Step 1 because her supervisor found the City had just cause to issue the oral reprimand to the grievant based on the conduct at issue. Alderman Rockwell noted at Step 2, the grievance went before the Personnel Committee and both the City and the Grievant were provided the opportunity to present their respective positions. During the Step 2 meeting, the Union argued they were seeking information about holiday pay and they confirmed the Grievant offered to get the employee records from the Clerk's Office. The Union further argued the conduct was no big deal and the oral reprimand was a complete overkill and that the City should have an explicit rule

Prohibiting exactly what the Grievant did in order for her to know it was wrong. At one point during the meeting, the Grievant again attempted to claim Jim Grafton gave her permission to take the records, but she ultimately acknowledged again that this was not true. The Union conceded that if the City wanted information about its members they would only provide that information after getting proper authorization, acknowledging that the City's point about disseminating employee records without authorization. The city argued that Ms. Pirmann cannot access and disseminate employee records without authorization or approval unless necessary and required for the completion of her official duties. After considering all of the information, the Personnel Committee determined Ms. Pirmann accessed employee timesheets and shared them with non-City employees after hours without authorization and not within the scope of performing duties. As a result the Personnel Committee denied the grievance at Step 2. Alderman Rockwell noted that now pursuant to Step 3 of Article 11 the Union has the right to present the grievance to the City Council and that is why we are here tonight. Alderman Rockwell then allowed the Union to present their position. Audie Schmidt, Staff Representative for AFSCME 1234, explained that the Union has tried to settle this disagreement on separate occasions, and we are very disappointed that did not happen, which is why we are here tonight. She noted that Jim Grafton was there in the office and consent was implied and helped her by telling her what records she should access that was first thing. Audie continued, the second thing is, the just cause provision a lot of you probably know what that is. There are seven tests of just cause, you have to pass every single test in order to discipline someone and not violate the contract. The issue here is that the City of Silvis does not pass the just cause provision test of notice. No one who was there had no idea Shannon was doing anything wrong. There has never been any policy that she had been made aware of absolutely none. So because of this we are going to have to rely on what the contract says. That test is going to be a problem for the City when this goes to arbitration. She had no idea that she was breaking any rule she would not have done this if she knew she was breaking a rule, I would not have let her do it. Audie said again she was really disappointed we did not get this settled. Alderwoman Cary Unsicker welcomed Audie to her new position. Alderwoman Unsicker expressed her personal opinion about this that she is surprised that we are because, one I would have thought common sense would have dictated you don't get files after work hours to share and disseminate. Audie said that was right, if we weren't the Union the Union has the right to those documents. Alderwoman Unsicker stated that anyone who knows me will tell you I am very pro-union, but I don't know how you guys have the right to expect her to go into an office that is closed and get information about other employees. Audie interrupted Alderwoman Unsicker saying it is exactly the same thing, Audie stated that she has members all over the place that work for all types of government. If I call one of them and one of my members happens to work in the office and I call and ask what is the status of this person, I get the information. Alderwoman Unsicker noted that this was not about people (unintelligible as both were speaking at the same time). Audie said that she is entitled to that information. Alderwoman Unsicker said okay obviously I know if I shared a client's

information outside of my workplace I would be terminated instantly. Audie then stated that we are not talking about any clients. Alderwoman Unsicker then said this brings me to my second point is, although I have never had an oral reprimand, I don't understand and I have never had the privilege of being a union member, but cannot believe you would grieve an oral reprimand. Audie said it is a violation of the contract. Alderwoman Unsicker then said that is your position and this is mine. Alderwoman Unsicker said that is all she has to say and she is very disappointed that we are here taking Council time on an oral reprimand. Alderman Tony Trulson questioned if the grievant had ever had FOIA training. The grievant answered "nothing current". Alderman Trulson asked if at one time you were trained on that. The grievant answered 3 years ago. Alderman Trulson said the reason I am asking is because of the privacy act requires the AMC to give public notice that the privacy act prohibits the disclosure of information from the system of records absent of the written consent of the subject individual himself. Alderman Trulson said with this position it is not just about the contract but if you are breaking the law that is why I am asking. Audie answered that you are missing the point we are the union, Alderman Trulson interjected that the Union does not put you above the law. Audie continued that the Union has rights to information that others do not. Alderman Trulson noted that that information cannot be disseminated without written approval. Audie said the Union has access to any information they need. Alderman Trulson stated that having been a Union Steward and being a member of the State Government I am familiar with the authorities of the Union. Alderman Trulson said that no Union, no Union can break the law. If the law says that those records are protected then they should only be given to or disseminated by someone without a written request from the City Government. Alderman Trulson reiterated even the Union has to submit the written request. Audie said the Union does not need to give a written request. Alderman Tony Trulson asked if the written request was submitted prior to the dissemination of that record. Audie answered "not formally". Alderman Trulson asked how the document was requested. Audie said she asked Shannon to prove it as we were working on writing a draft for the contract. I asked her if Shannon knew anything about a certain position as we had a misunderstanding and we were trying to get to the bottom of it and in doing our due diligence we needed to know how Union people were being paid for holidays. Audie stated that is information that the Union does not submit a FOIA request for. There are somethings we have to FOIA, but other things we do not have to FOIA. Audie said the information they had they do not need to FOIA. Alderman Trulson stated that according to what you just said the Union has to submit a request still and from what you are saying it does not sound like you submitted that request. Audie said that she can just call and ask. Alderman Trulson asked Audie if she did call and ask. Audie said yes she asked Shannon to provide the information. Alderman Trulson noted that Shannon was not on duty. Audie noted that she just wanted to lay out the legal case for the Union. Audie said we a straying from the case her because what the case is about is the Grievant has no idea that she was breaking any policy. Alderman Trulson added that what he is trying to

say is after studying the FOIA I think she should have known. City Attorney Graham Lee asked if the City of Silvis send people over to AFSCME to go in and search your records. Audie said she thought the City could, Attorney Lee then included "without anyone approving it within the Union". Audie answered that it has never happened. Alderman Joshua Dyer asked if there were official channels for these requests. If the Union has a request don't they ask the City? Audie answered that even when she asks Mr. Grafton for information he sends it to me, there is no formal process. Alderman Dyer stated that Jim Grafton is the Administrator of the City and not part of the Union. Audie said it is normal for her to call the City and tell them I need a document and they get it for me. Alderman Dyer said it seems like a poor procedure on the Unions behalf. Alderman Dyer said to just ask members on the "sly" doesn't seem right. I seems to me that the right choice would be for the Union to submit a formal request to the City rather than to try to ask a Union member on the "sly" for information. Alderman Dyer noted that Shannon is an employee of the City and a member of the Union, is she a representative of the Union? Is she a steward? Audie answered that she was just a member. Alderman Dyer said he feels for Shannon here because it seems to be in a tight place over a request from her Union and Shannon provided this. The Union should have made a request to the City for this information not a request of one of their members. Alderman Rick Lohse asked if Shannon has access to the records after office hours. Alderman Rick Lohse asked if these records were accessed after normal hours. Audie did agree that it was after normal hours but managers were still here. Alderman Lohse asked if the office was officially closed. Audie answered she did not know if the records was closed or not. Alderman Rick Lohse asked if Shannon thought having access to the office & records after hours is alright. Alderman Lohse asked if this is something that she would think would be OK. Mayor Matt Carter asked if at this time there is any new information.

19) City Staff Reports

A) Fire Department:

Fire Chief John Winters informed Council that retired Fire Chief Bob Leibovitz passed away last week. Chief Winters said he never had an opportunity to work under Chief Bob Leibovitz but still learned a lot from him and about him. Chief Winters said he had bounced ideas off him and was given honest answers, never told me what to do, only what to expect. Chief Winters said Chief Bob Leibovitz did tell him he was walking into the best job he could ever have. Chief Winters said not only was he the Fire Chief but was on City Council, served on multiple Boards I would like to say the City of Silvis lost a great citizen in former Fire Chief Bob Leibovitz. Fire Chief Winters then said that the Parks, Building & Grounds Minutes from yesterday (August 20th) the correction for that needs to say JL Brady bid for the Fire Department will include 2 visits per year not 4. Chief Winters informed Council that another Firefighter was hired last night pending him passing his physical and drug screen and his name is Cameron Poppe. Chief Winters then thanked Police Chief Mark VanKlaveren and Amanda Sherwood, Director of Main Street, for all the work they have done putting together the operations plan for the 2018 Moonlight Parade. Chief Winters said seeing what goes on from this side of the table makes me appreciate even more what it takes to organize the Moonlight Parade. Chief Winters stated that last Saturday the Fire Department they did a last minute Blood Drive and we were able to get 12 donors which is a little under what we do in January. August 31st to September 7th Chief Winters will be out of Country.

B) Inspections:

Inspector Tom Lupinski told Council we have a couple of new home starts one in Deere Meadows and another in the 100 block of 16th Street. Inspector Lupinski said that they were grading the floor at FS and getting ready to pour concrete.

C) Police: Chief Mark VanKlaveren explained he has been preparing his operations plan and he will have 31 Police Officers there. Chief VanKlaveren will use Council Chambers as the operations center. Chief VanKlaveren noted that he will have the eye in the sky for the kid's zone. Historically we have had a cope on every block and when trouble breaks out everyone responds it will not be that way we will have our bike officers or UTV Vehicles respond. Alderman Trulson attended the interviews for Investigator and we had two candidates, Seth Rohweder and John VanHyning. John VanHyning is our K-9 Officer and we have had ELKO in service since 2013. John VanHyning was the choice for the position. Officer VanHyning has the experience and is a professional guy. Seth Rohweder is a great cop, he is our Police Officer who is in the bars late at night and has a way with the bar crowd. Alderman Trulson stated that he sat in and Seth is a great Police officer but, I think John VanHyning had the experience for the job. John will still maintain the K-9, he will do his investigations and take Elko out on locker searches when needed. Officer VanHyning will still get on call pay for other K-9 needs.

D) Public Works & Parks:

Jim Grafton reminded everyone that the Masonic Lodge will have a breakfast on Sunday September 9th at the Silvis Masonic Lodge and the money raised will be for smoke detectors & CO2 detectors. Whatever the Silvis Masonic Lodge raises the money will be doubled from their main Lodge. The hours for the breakfast are from 7:30am until 11:00am. The goal is to raise one thousand dollars. 
